Conquer the Concrete:

We are doing demonstration of Wiffle Ball at the Oshkosh Boys & Girls Club on March 12 & April 9. Talk to Andy to volunteer either of the two dates.

Simplified Rules:

Players in rotation

This is the order of entry into the field of play:

Into outfield, after batter is out or advances, then go to

Catcher, after batter is out or advances, then go to

Pitching, after batter is out or advances, then go to

At Bat

There are NO walks regardless of number of balls! THERE ARE NO forced Outs!

Strikes are swings and misses

Or, ball is untouched by bat and goes into the blue Strike Box even if it bounces out!

Or, after three foul balls (less if there are long lines of kids) each foul is a strike

Total of three strikes you are out

Other ways to go out:

Ball in the air is caught by pitcher,

fielder or catcher (for the catcher the ball

MUST be over the head of batter first!), and in fair play.

Ball is hit in play before the First base line AND pitcher gathers ball into his/her hands

Advancing bases, on paper ONLY

Ball first hits in field of play before the first baseline and is not "caught" before the first base line, the batter gets a single, any runners on base advance ONE base

Ball first hits in the field of play on the first base line or before the second base line, batter gets a double, all other runners advance two bases.

Ball first hits in the field of play on the third base line and before the Home Run line, batter gets a triple, all runners go HOME.

Ball is in air and FAIR over the Home Run line, that is a home run, batter advances to Home as do all runners on base.

Batter who strike out or runners who make it to HOME, go to the back of the line to re-enter the field of play.

Make sure we tell the kids that at our tournament, there are teams and three team outs, then sides change from outfield to at bat.
