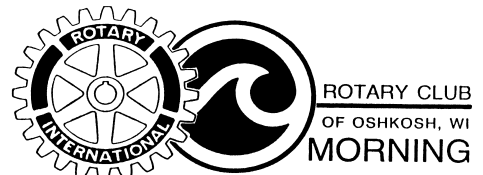

## Speaker:

Speaker was Cindy McGinnis Dahl, AuD, an audiologist with Mercy.

Her project is putting speaker systems in classrooms. She heard about that at a convention, came back and told the schools about it and they were enthusiastic, until they changed financial managers. Now there is no money.

The purpose of the sound systems is two-fold

1. To enable students to hear better (approximately 30% of kids have some sort of hearing difficulty)
2. To make it less fatiguing for the teachers. They can talk in a more normal voice and don't have to use their "teacher voice". So far, there is less sick leave for the teachers in classrooms with the system than normal classrooms.

She hopes to get enough money through grants to equip all of the classrooms in the Oshkosh School System.
